

## Future of the League Discussion Questions

1. In the survey, people answered very consistently that they think voter service and public education rank higher than advocacy and within our advocacy areas, they ranked stopping corruption in government and advocating for easier voting as the top two priorities they see for the League. Do you agree? What do you want New York to look like in the next 10-15 years? What kind of role do you think the League can play as a leader in this area? Is this the right way to launch ourselves into our second century?
2. Many people said we need to attract new, young members. This means we need to be relevant to the younger generations? How do we organize ourselves to make it easier for people to be involved? What are the ways we can tell people that they can do something in their busy lives?
3. Many of our donors ranked us as lower than other charities in their giving priorities. How do we make the case that our issues are worthy of support? How are we going to position ourselves for launching into the second century? Do you think we could increase our supporter base and do you think people would give money to set us up to be the leaders to get this accomplished? What programs/services do you think would help us change that distinction with our donors and attract new donors to the League? What would make you give a “stretch” gift?
