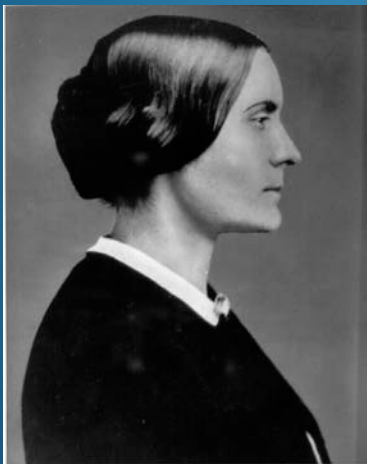


# What will the League of the Future Look Like?

# The Survey Says...

The following is a list of the issues for which the League has a position. Please place a check mark in the box next to the three that you feel are the most important focus for the League's energy and resources. *(Check only 3 boxes. Leave the remaining boxes blank.)*

- Election Laws: allowing registration on election day, voting before election day, easier to read ballots, and allowing absentee ballots without providing an excuse
- Ethics and Campaign Finance Reform: greater disclosure and limits on legislators' outside income and campaign contributions, public financing of campaigns, and pay to play limits
- Women's Issues: equal pay for women, stricter protections from domestic violence, and paid family leave
- Reproductive Choice: to ensure women in NYS have control over their own reproductive choices
- Healthcare: laws and regulations to ensure all have access to quality and affordable healthcare, safe staffing requirements at medical facilities, and funding for tobacco control programs.
- Environment: laws to support clean water and air, renewable energy (wind and solar), and restriction on hazardous waste labeling and disposal
- Financing Education: equitable and adequate funding across the state for public schools, and accountability requirements on charter schools
- Transportation: support for public transportation and safe transportation infrastructure
- Judicial Issues: support for merit selection of judges, more efficient court system, and improved protection of children in the justice system
- State Finances: reform of the state property tax system and transparency on state contracts and bidding
- Social Welfare: protections from discrimination in housing, employment, medical care, and public accommodations for all, and support for a living wage to meet basic human needs.
